## **Directions**

### **From The South, South West, South East and London**

1. Find your way to the M11/ M25 interchange.
2. Follow the M11 North, leaving at junction 9 towards Newmarket / Norwich / A11.
3. Follow the A11 which merges onto the A14.
4. Leave the A14 and head back on to the A11 at junction 38 towards Thetford / Norwich.
5. After passing around Thetford there is a roundabout – the fifth since leaving the A14. Take the 1<sup>st</sup> exit onto the A1075 towards Watton / E. Wretham.
6. Continue along A1075, pass through Watton and after a further 7 miles take a right turn which should be signposted for Yaxham. (If you miss it the road continues into Dereham where you can turn right at the end and follow the road back towards Yaxham)
7. Continue into Yaxham, over the railway and to the T-junction. Turn left here and follow the B1135 (Dereham Road) for a quarter of a mile or so – the holiday park is on your left.

### **From The West & Lower Midlands**

For places like Birmingham, the A14 is probably best, then follow the above directions from point 4.

### **From Upper Midlands and the North**

For Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire and a further north:

1. Make your way to Kings Lynn (via A1, A17 from North or A52/A17/A47 from Nottingham or A47 from Leicester / Peterborough)
2. Follow A47 towards Norwich.
3. Leave the A47 onto the A1075 for Dereham / Watton
4. In quick succession: Turn right onto A1075 (Tavern Lane) then turn right again onto A1075 onto Yaxham Road. At the roundabout take the 3<sup>rd</sup> exit onto Yaxham Road (B1135).
5. The campsite is about a mile further on your right.

### **From The East**

1. Find your way to the A47 heading west.
2. Exit the A47 onto the A1075 signposted for Dereham / Watton.
3. Take the 1<sup>st</sup> exit onto the B1135 towards Yaxham.
4. The campsite is about a mile further on your right.

### **Rail**

Nearest station is Yaxham but it's a bit unusual since it is not on the main rail network but is in fact served by the Mid Norfolk Railway who operate a part commuter / part steam railway connecting Wymondham with Dereham. Mainline trains run to Wymondham which is about 10 miles away. The Dereham branch line is a bit part time so please check on their website: <http://www.mnr.org.uk/services/>
