

Midweek Cycling Tours In Suffolk

4 NIGHT MIDWEEK TOURS

Available from 1st June - 14th July
Start Monday, Finish Friday.

START AT EYKE

A mass of varied cycling opportunities in the Dunwich Area. Cycle heathlands and forests or take a trip to Southwold and Beccles.

Cycle the northern section of the Suffolk Coastal Route and spend an extra day in Dunwich where you will be spoiled by the amazing heathland and coastal views. Crumbling Cliffs and forest tracks surround the local area with long or short distance trips to Southwold or Beccles on offer. On your return trip you will visit historic Framlingham, where you can visit the castle or wander the alleyways and lanes of this popular Suffolk town.

Day 1, Monday

Arrive in Eyke

Drive to your starting campsite near Eyke, NE of Woodbridge. You will park your vehicle here for the duration of your holiday.
Bicycles will be delivered to your tent during the day.

Day 2, Tuesday

Eyke to Dunwich

Take a track across Rendlesham Forest and cycle into Orford, an attractive small town steeped in history. Here you can visit the castle or take a river trip to admire amazing coastal scenery.
Continuing onwards through Snape and the smuggling hamlet of Eastbridge, will bring you to the coastal village of Dunwich, with its abundance of spectacular cliff top views and nature reserves which are managed by the national trust.

Choose to detour off to popular Aldeburgh, Thorpeness, Leiston or Sizewell.
Alternatively take a short cut through Dunwich forest to enjoy some off road cycling.

Day 3, Wednesday

Day tours around Dunwich (Optional Rest Day)

A choice of tours around Dunwich.
Take a long tour to Beccles and Southwold. 40+ miles in length it will take you past a church built within a church's ruins at Covehithe. Alternatively take a short trip into Southwold via the foot ferry over the River Blythe, cycle back the long way via the bustling market town of Halesworth.
A third option keeps to the coastal heathlands east of Westleton and south of Dunwich and offers lots of off road cycling.

Lots of alternatives in the area, including cycling in Dunwich Forest and doing absolutely nothing but sunbathing on the beach.

Day 4, Thursday

Dunwich To Eyke

Through Dunwich forest and along quiet lanes to the pretty village of Peasenhall, with its thatched and colour washed cottages. Continuing on through historic Framlingham, where you can visit the castle or muse the shops which line the narrow alleyways and streets before reaching your campsite in Eyke.

Forest tracks across Dunwich Heath offer an off road alternative and shortcuts that bring you though Tunstall Forest to Eyke rather than via Framlingham.
